<p>VISA</p>	<p>Students from outside the European Union entering Poland need a valid passport and visa (if required). Detailed information is available at Polish embassies and consulates. Students from EU countries can come to Poland with a valid identity card or passport (no visa). A stay of up to 3 months does not require registration. For longer stays there is a need to obtain a residence permit. <p>Accommodation</p>	<p>The Academy of Fine Arts in Warsaw does not have a student hall of residence. Erasmus students usually share flats together or with local students. We provide some contacts and we also send adverts for accommodation to all accepted students. We usually recommend staying in one of Warsaw's youth hostels until you find proper accommodation. Students usually look for flats in the centre of the city: Śródmieście, the Old Town, Mokotów, Muranów and Powiśle. We also recommend green and peaceful districts like old Żoliborz, Saska Kępa, old Ochota. Some students choose a housing estate in the Ursynów district near the underground.</p>
<p>Insurance</p>	<p>Foreign students are required to take out insurance before their arrival in Poland. Students coming from EU countries who hold the European Health Insurance Card are entitled to free medical treatment in Poland.</p> <p>We also strongly recommend that you purchase accident insurance</p>

	<p>and liability insurance (related to unintentional damage) for the period of study in Poland.</p> <p>Students from outside the EU should buy a package of medical, accident and liability insurance before their arrival. There is also an opportunity to purchase an individual health insurance agreement with the National Health Fund in Poland (NFZ)</p> <p>For more information see: http://www.nfz.gov.pl (National Health Found) and www.msz.gov.pl (Ministry of Foreign Affairs)</p> <p>Holders of “Karta Polaka” are entitled to free medical treatment in Poland</p>
Transport	<p>Students can program 90-day travelcard on their student ID which entitles to any number of journeys and is valid for all means of public transport.</p>
Living costs	<p>Poland’s official currency is the zloty (PLN), divided into 100 groszy. The currency comes in coins (from 1 grosz to 5 zloty) and bills (from 10 to 200 zloty).</p> <p>Below you can find approximate monthly basic living expenses:</p> <p>Accommodation – 800-1500 PLN</p> <p>Meals - approx. 700 PLN (meal in our academic canteen 15-20 PLN, milk bar 8-15 PLN, restaurant 30-70 PLN)</p> <p>The cost of studying at the Academy</p> <p>200 PLN - This is approximately the cost of necessary materials for one month of study at the Academy.</p> <p>You will have to invest in charcoal, pencils, crayons, paints, canvas, prints etc.</p> <p>If you are studying graphic arts, design and interior design you will be asked to prepare large prints for the session (cost from 30 PLN to 55 PLN for each A2 print). Some lecturers agree to replace prints with a multimedia presentation.</p> <p>Up to several hundred zlotys might be needed to cover the cost of a model for your project while studying design or interior design.</p> <p>Several hundred zlotys may be needed to cover the cost of special accessories at the Faculty of Conservation but they can be used for many years afterwards. Students are also required to cover the cost of the documentation of their work.</p>
